Bootcamp in Nigeria

We are thrilled to share the successful completion of the AfriConEU Bootcamp in Nigeria, 12-14 September, organized by Emerging Communities Africa, expressing our heartfelt gratitude to the participating teams, mentors, and partners whose collaborative efforts ensured the resounding success of this transformative event. With over 80 eager participants, seven dedicated facilitators, five inspirational speakers, four engaging panelists, and numerous collaborative teams pushing the boundaries of innovation, the Bootcamp was a true celebration of African talent and the power of collaboration. The audience had the opportunity to hear from experts on hot topics, such as "Understanding the African business landscape: Nigeria", and "Investment as a tool for catalyzing economic growth in Africa". Across three impactful days, attendees immersed themselves in ideation, consolidated their project concepts, and presented innovative solutions to real users and potential investors.

Charting a Path Forward: AfriConEU Consortium Meeting in Abuja

On September 15, 2023, the AfriConEU's partners came together for one more in-person meeting, marking a successful event filled with enthusiasm and a shared commitment to advancing the project's goals. This gathering, following the successful execution of three Bootcamps and building upon the progress since their last meeting in Tanzania, focused on evaluating the recent Bootcamp in Nigeria, identifying areas for improvement for the upcoming Bootcamp in Ghana, and outlining plans for the Final Capitalization Event in Portugal. The consortium also engaged in a thoughtful discussion on the Deployment Toolkit, brainstorming ways to ensure that AfriConEU's activities have a lasting positive influence on the communities they engage with.

Bootcamp in Ghana

We are happy to share the successful conclusion of our last Bootcamp in Africa, the AfriConEU Bootcamp in Ghana, 19-21 September, organized by hapaSpace. Following a similar format with the previous Bootcamps, we engaged a great number of stakeholders from the local digital innovation ecosystem in Kumasi. Throughout this transformative experience, more than 80 participants enthusiastically engaged in a shared desire to learn and make a positive impact. Seven dedicated facilitators expertly nurtured the entrepreneurial spirit, while seven inspiring speakers and five esteemed panelists enriched the collective knowledge with their insights.





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As an added value for all parties involved, we hosted unique talks and discussions on "The Rich Tapestry of Ashanti Culture and the Flourishing of Entrepreneurship", and "Unlocking Africa's Economic Potential: The AfCFTA as a Catalyst for Startups and Inclusive Growth". The Bootcamp fostered a culture of collaboration among several teams, pushing the boundaries of innovation. The event genuinely celebrated African talent and the remarkable power of effective collaboration.

Final Capitalization Event

In Porto, the AfriConEU Capitalization Event unfolded from October 25th to 28th, marking the pinnacle of a project dedicated to fostering connections between Africa and Europe in the digital innovation and networking sphere. We started with a visit to UPTEC, a renowned Portuguese Science and Technology park hosting a Digital Innovation Hub. Participants then convened at the esteemed Porto Business School to discuss the project's significant achievements and future trajectory, giving the space to three AfriConEU ambassadors from Mozambique, Tanzania, and Ghana to share their journeys of impact in person. Climaxing with the Porto Tech Hub Conference, the event provided a global stage for AfriConEU to showcase its work and accomplishments to the broader tech community, informing more than 700 participants and contributing with panel discussions on the project's outcomes.

ARS Electronica 2023: Re-build Together: The ARS Electronica 2023 festival in Austria emerged as a dynamic convergence of minds, offering a multitude of sessions exploring diverse themes. Notably, the session titled "Re-build together: digital, human, and arts-driven innovation in Africa," co-organized by Starts4Africa and AfriConEU, shone as a standout highlight. The expertly moderated panel, featuring voices such as Chris Emezue of the Masakhane Project, David Shongo from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Gideon Brefo from hapaSpace Collaborative Hub in Ghana, and Michaela or Tammy from the Art Meets collective in South Africa, delved into the intricate theme of innovation in Africa.

.eu Web Awards Recognition

The year concluded triumphantly for AfriConEU as the project was honored with the prestigious .eu Web Award in "The Laurels" category. In a dazzling ceremony at Maison du Bois in Brussels, AfriConEU stood in the spotlight, celebrating its unwavering commitment to innovation, creativity, and online prowess, distinguishing itself among the best in the digital landscape. The journey towards this accolade commenced on August 1st when AfriConEU decided to participate in the competition, even though it had been open since April 18. Through the dedication and support of our community, we proudly secured 601 votes (the second-highest number) from an impressive total of 863 nominations. At the last phase, a jury of 5 experts evaluated the finalists and chose the winners' websites based on the criteria of Content, Structure, Navigation and Functionality, Visual Design, and Accessibility.
